Register or Renew Your Ely Golf Cart & ATV Permit

A new UTV/Golf Cart/ATV ordinance took effect in 2022. Your UTV/Golf Cart/ATV permit is an annual permit that must be renewed by July 1. The city is working to have the flags in at City Hall by May 1. The registration fee is \$25 per year for Golf Carts and ATV's only, there is no fee for UTV's but you still most register with the city. The City Clerk or Deputy Clerk must inspect the vehicle before issuing a new registration. The permit and more information can be found online or in person at City Hall.

Public Works Will Flush Water System in April & May

This is routine maintenance that is performed to maintain good water quality in the system. Throughout this time period you may occasionally notice minor discoloration to the water while the flushing is taking place; the water poses no health risk and is safe to drink. Public Works has a goal of flushing every Ely hydrant in 2024.

Pool Fills / Outside Water Use

In 2017, the City Council passed an ordinance allowing residents to purchase a second meter to track water that is used outside for watering, pool fills, washing cars, etc. Due to this water not going into the sewer, the City will give a credit for the sewer portion. Curbside Limb Pickup Policy April - October

1 Brush and limbs will be picked up at your curb by the City of Ely Public Works Department every Tuesday starting at 8am during the months of April - October at no charge.

 \mathbf{O} All limbs must be cut to a length not to L exceed 8' and must be less than 6'' in diameter.

) All limbs must be trimmed of their smaller **J** branches.

4 All limbs and brush shall be placed by the curb in a neat pile. Please avoid one large pile but rather put in smaller piles for easy hand pickup.

DO NOT tie or bundle brush together. J Simply place them in a pile at curbside.

All brush and limbs will be chipped on site **O** and may leave a small amount of debris. The homeowner will be responsible to "sweep" this up occasionally.

7 This service is not intended for the removal I of an entire tree but for trimmings only. If you are removing an entire tree, you should arrange to have it removed and hauled away. In the case of a windstorm or an emergency event, this policy may be changed to accommodate the extra material.

O DO NOT place leaves, garden waste or grass O clippings at your curbside, they will **NOT** be picked up. These items can be taken to the compost bunker near the water tower at 1124 Vista Rd.

(If your brush pile does not follow the guide-J lines listed above, it will not be picked up by the Citv.

City Park Parking Lot • On January 31, 16 bids were received and reviewed for this project. The low bid being \$206,812.25 from Dave Schmitt Construction. The bid came in \$50,000 lower than the engineer's original estimate! Phase 1 of this concrete parking lot will include 41 standard stalls, 3 handicap accessible spaces, a sidewalk connecting the lot to the pavilion area and a chip & seal access drive from Northgate to the new parking area. Construction of this parking lot on the north end of City Park will begin later this spring. Keep an eye out for updates as they become available.

Banner Valley Sidewalk • The current phase of the Banner Valley Sidewalk Project includes Pacific St. to Rock Island Dr. The city is working on cost estimates to add one more block of sidewalk to include Rock Island Dr. to Glendale Ln. If it works within the FY25 budget, the additional block of sidewalk will be added into the project. Estimated costs will be presented to council this spring for approval.

Old Town District Phase 1 • After a public hearing on February 5, council approved the Phase 1 of the Old Town District Infrastructure Project to be put out for bid. Received bids were opened at City Hall on February 27 with staff and project engineers. Council reviewed the bids at the March 4 meeting and approved the contract to the lowest bidder, Mainline Construction. A preconstruction meeting will take place in later March - early April.
