Renew Golf Cart & ATV Permit

Reminder, your annual golf cart/ATV permit was supposed to be renewed by April 1, so it is essential that you renew it as soon as possible. The registration fee is \$25 per year; and the City Clerk/ Administrator must inspect the vehicle before issuing a registration. Stop by City Hall Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. to renew your permit.

Ely Construction Projects

At the March meeting council accepted a bid from Boomerang Corporation, Anamosa. Iowa in the amount of \$1,079,588 "to resurface State Street and Vavra Drive. The bid includes replacing some water and sewer lines, a new sidewalk from Solon State Bank to Northgate. and storm sewer work. The council will consider an alternate bid at the April 8 Council meeting. The alternate bid in the amount of \$73,165 includes a sidewalk along Vavra Drive, a parking area at Vavra Park, steps going into Vavra Park and a sidewalk from the parking to a future shelter area. Mowing Ordinance

The City of Ely has posted the mowing ordinance at the Bank, Post Office, City Hall and Library. Please note that the ordinance requires all developed residential properties be moved any time the vegetation reaches a height of more than six (6) inches during the months of April, May, June, July, August, Sept. and Oct. of each year. Vegetation shall be measured from the ground to the tip of the longest blade. Any undeveloped residential property within the City of Ely, is required to be mowed and maintained a minimum of at least one time per month during the months of May, June, July, August, Sept. and Oct. of each year.

Any business and industrial areas within the City of Ely, whether vacant or occupied. is required to be moved any time the vegetation reaches a height of more than six (6) inches during the months of April, May, June, July, August, Sept. and Oct. of each year. Vegetation shall be measured from the ground to the tip of the longest blade.

Outside Water Use/ Pool Fills

In 2017, the city council passed a new ordinance allowing residents to purchase a second meter to track water that is used outside for watering, pool fills, washing cars, etc. Because this water does not go into the city sewer, the city makes provisions to give an allowance for the sewer portion. If a resident purchases a large water meter and hard plumbs the meter into their home the city will read the meter each month along with the regular house meter, however, we only charge for water on the second meter, not sewer. If it is difficult to hard plumb a meter in, residents have the options to purchase an "*outside' meter that they can hook directly to their garden hose. At the end of the water season, residents are required to turn in a reading for the "*outside" meter and the city will reimburse the resident for the sewer portion on the gallons that went through the meter. Please note that credits for pool fills will not be allowed any longer unless they are tracked by one of the two above options. *Outside meters can be purchased at Elv City Hall for \$75.00

Public Works Will Flush Water System

Beginning in April through June 2019, we perform this is routine maintenance to maintain good water quality in the system. You may occasionally notice minor discoloration to the water while this is being done; the water poses no health risk and is safe to drink, even though it may look a little different.

Tree Trimming

Elv Ordinances state that property owners with trees along a street, shall keep the trees on, or overhanging the street trimmed so that all branches will be at least fifteen (15) feet above the surface of the street and eight (8) feet above the sidewalks. If you are unable to trim your trees, there are good contractors in the area that you can hire.

Curbside Limb Pickup Policy April - October

- 1. Brush and limbs will be picked up at your curb by Ely Public Works Department every Monday starting at 8:00 AM during the months of April – October at no charge. If items are not out at the time of passing, they will be picked up the following Monday.
- 2. All limbs must be cut to a length not to exceed 8 foot and must be less than 6 inches
- 3. All limbs must be trimmed of smaller branches.
- 4. All limbs and brush shall be placed by the curb in a neat pile. Please avoid one large pile but rather put in a couple of smaller piles for easy had pick up.
- 5. DO NOT TIE OR BUNDLE BRUSH TOGETHER. Simply place them at the curbside.
- 6. All brush and limbs will be chipped on sight and may leave a small amount of debris. the homeowner will be responsible to "sweep" this up occasionally
- 7. PLEASE DO NOT PLACE LEAVES, GARDEN WASTE, WEEDS OR GRASS CLIP-PINGS CURB SIDE - THEY WILL NOT BE PICKED UP. These items can be taken to the compost bunker located at the Water Tower off Jappa Road.
- 8. This service is not intended for the removal of an entire tree but is for trimmings only. If you are removing and entire tree you should arrange to have it removed and hauled away.
- 9. In the case of a wind storm, or an emergency event, this policy may be changed to accommodate the extra material.

When taking lawn waste to the compost pile it creates a large amount of work for staff and also secondary services are hired to haul away the excess which costs Ely taxpayers. While Ely City Council realize the benefits of providing a compost drop site, a goal this year is to reduce the amount of lawn waste being dropped at the site. - EBilling you can receive your utility bill by email rather than US Mail.
- ACH complete a form and you no longer need to worry about writing a check. You will still receive a bill at the beginning of the month and will let you know the amount to be deducted from your checking or savings account.
- Credit Cards the city now accepts major credit or debit cards for the payments either over the phone or stop in person to city hall.
