

Council Meetings



There were two budget workshops with Council in January, the first was to review departmental budgets. The second workshop covered smaller capital projects for FY25 including a new plow truck, Banner Valley sidewalk, and Well #1 maintenance and upgrades. The new fiscal year will begin on July 1, 2024. Urban Renewal Plan

An updated Urban Renewal Plan was adopted by council. This plan will allow the city to collect TIF funds from the new Founders Grove development off Rogers Creek Road and the Main Street Legacy Development on Main Street. The TIF funds will be used towards future infrastructure and economic development projects in Ely.

What is TIF?

Local governments fund development projects within a designated district through property taxes generated from that district over a multiyear period. In effect, this means that a certain amount of property tax revenue (the increment generated above an established base value) is diverted from affected entities, including school districts.

Council approved the new Comp Plan for the city. This comp plan will be the road map used for the next decade for city planning.

Since 2023, Council and the Park Board have been working on plans for a parking lot addition at City Park. Phase 1 of the lot, located to the north of the pond, would be completed in 2024. Contractor bids were opened on January 31. Council will be reviewing bids and selecting a contractor at the Feb. 5 meeting.



PROJECT UPDATES

Phase 1: Old Town District Infrastructure Project

What does this project include?

- Replacing all old infrastructure under Main Street (from Dows to Traer) and Traer Street including stormwater, water, and sewer lines
- Widened black topped roads to include parking on both sides of each street with concrete intersections
- Sidewalks on both sides of Main & Traer
- Improvements will accommodate new commercial development downtown
- New public parking lot on Main. (across from the Legion between Dan & Debbies and Krobs)
- Improved bump-outs for traffic calming on Dows at State Street, Walker and Main
- Additional off-street bicycle parking
- Improvements to the trail crossing at Dows
- Dedicated area for Ely All-Veterans Memorial
- Improvements to the trail crossing at Dows
- Improved stormwater management as the Old Town District is susceptible to flash flooding



Example of impact: Currently, the average water portion of the utility bill in Ely is \$30.00 per month, the proposed rate changes would increase this to approximately \$45.00/month.

Estimated cost of the project: \$2.9M

- Portion funded by existing revenue sources: \$1.0M
- Portion that will need to be funded by a new revenue source: \$1.9M

How does it impact you?

The city is planning to use a 20-year low interest loan which would be paid back via resident's water bill. This is currently estimated to be approximately a \$15/month increase to the water portion of the city utilities bill. The increase would take place starting July 1st, 2024.

If you have any questions or comments, please reach out to the City Administrator at City Hall or contact an elected official. There will be a public hearing during the Council Meeting on Monday, 2/5, at 7:00pm for residents to comment on the project.


