**First Reading of an Ordinance 294 Amending Zoning Code.** Presented to council for consideration is the first reading of an ordinance amending the zoning code for the City of Ely on 55.54 acres of property within the City of Ely from R1/R2 to only R2. This has been reviewed and approved by the planning and zoning commission. Approximately 64% of the lots will be single family and 36% of the lots will be two-family owner occupied residential. No public questions or comments. Motion by Hale to approve first reading as written, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Symonds. By Roll Call All Ayes-5 motion carried.

**First Reading of an Updated Noise Ordinance 295** Presented to council consideration for the first reading of an ordinance updating noise ordinance. Council held a public comment meeting and a review at a council meeting. Staff has prepared the following code based on comment received from council and public. This update improves the code detail and allows for the noise infractions to be handled as a nuisance rather than only a criminal situation. No public questions or comments. **Request to Approve IFA Loan Agreement** Presented to council for consideration a request to approve a financing agreement for the Trunk Sewer project that has been awarded. Council reviewed 3 options to fund the project in the past from 2018 to present. There was in depth discussion by council, Speer Financial, and the community.
