City Department Reports: Linn County Sheriff gave report on number of calls for services 12/20/21 to 1/14/22. City Administrator Thompson gave update on CO2 Pipeline, ADM now working with a new contractor from Canada. Thompson thanked city staff on the snow removal and the recent work on the service line break at Ely Manor.

Community Comments/Requests: Councilman Symonds recommended the council personnel committee consider MLK Day as a recognized holiday for City Staff.

Business: Proclamation for Human Trafficking Prevention and Awareness Month Mayor, Eldy Miller proclaimed January as Human Trafficking Prevention and Awareness Month. First Reading of Ordinance 2022.296 Amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of Ely, Iowa, Chapter 75, and Chapter 77, Pertaining to All-terrain Vehicles and Golf Carts: Presented to council for consideration was the first reading of an ordinance amending Chapter 75 and Chapter 77 of City Code related to Golf Carts, ATVs, UTV, and other off-road vehicles. The update provides for the use of registered vehicles at night, drivers 16 and older, parents/guardian liability for violations by dependents, and more strict penalties for those who violate the ordinance. No public comments. Motion to close public hearing made by Symonds, 2nd by Becicka. Roll Call All Ayes-5 motion carried.

First Reading of Ordinance 2022.297 Amending Zoning Code: Presented to council for consideration was the first reading of an ordinance amending the zoning code for the City of Ely. A request was received to amend zoning at 1465 Main Street within the City of Ely from R1-A to only C1. The property is planned to be used by Odies for events and other business-related uses. Motion to close public hearing made by Wery, 2nd by Tuthill. Roll Call All Ayes-5 motion carried.

Resolution to set a Date for a Public Hearing related to the Max Levy Hearing: Presented to council for consideration a resolution setting the date for the Max Levy Hearing related to the FY 2023 Budget. Motion made by Tuthill to set public hearing for February 7th, 2022, 2nd by Symonds. Roll Call All Ayes-5 motion carried.

Request to Approve Request for Qualifications for GIS services related to the GIS Project: Presented to council for consideration a request to approve the RFQ for GIS services. The City of Ely received a grant for \$20,000 to support the development of a GIS program for the city. Staff recommends hiring a highly qualified consultant to assist with the development of the GIS program. The RFQ outlines the qualifications the city is looking for. It is recommended to hire a consultant at the February 21st meeting. Motion made by Wery to approve RFQ for GIS Services, 2nd by Symonds. All Ayes-5 motion carried.

Request to Approve Pay Request #2 Related to the Trunk Sewer Project Presented to council for consideration was a request to approve pay request #2 to Schrader Excavating and Grading totaling \$77,457.30 related to the truck sewer project. The pay request has been reviewed by City Engineer and City Staff. Motion made by Symonds to approve pay request, 2nd by Whitaker. Roll Call All Ayes-5 motion carried.

With no further business being evident, council adjourned the meeting at 7:28 pm. Motion by Symonds, 2nd by Becicka. 5-0 Ayes motion carried.
